Public Hearing:

To consider the rezoning of the following parcel:

Permanent Parcel No. 028-19A-17-150, located at 110 W. Union Street from R-3, High Density Urban Residential to M-U, Multi-Use to be incorporated into a new lot for 427 N. Court St. through a minor subdivision process.

FOR rezoning: Mr. Mendel stated in order to do significant improvements and upgrades to the existing Sunoco gas station at 427 N. Court Street the applicant is requesting to do a minor subdivision to increase the size of the lot by moving 12.75 feet from the adjacent house property that they own at 110 W. Union Street. The house is zoned R-3 and the gas station is zoned M-U.

Ms. Sarai, the property owner of 427 N. Court St. stated she wants the building to look nice, they would like to be able to bring the coolers outside into the store to eliminate some issues they have had in the past like the pop freezing in the winter. This expansion would allow for more stocking of product.

To consider the rezoning of the following parcel:

Permanent Parcel No. 028-19A-21-376, located at 139 W. Liberty from C-2, Central Business to P-F Public Facilities.

FOR Rezoning: Mr. Mendel stated in 2014 the City of Medina purchased the subject property which is formerly the Masonic Temple and Medina Theater. The property is planned to be incorporated into the city's land holdings in this part of the downtown to be partially used for the new Municipal Court House building project. The property is approximately 31,000 sq. ft. and currently is zoned C-2. The existing city owned property to the north and south being City Hall and the Liberty parking lot are publically owned and public uses are zoned P-F. Since this property is planned for public use it should be rezoned from C-2 to P-F. The Planning Commission recommended this rezoning at the July 9th meeting this year.

Mr. Shields moved that the minutes from the regular meeting on September 14th, 2015, as prepared and presented by the Clerk be approved, seconded by Mr. Kolesar. The roll was called and the minutes were approved by the yea votes of J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, M. Kolesar, B. Lamb, P. Rose, and J. Shields.

Reports of Municipal Officers:

Dennis Hanwell, Mayor, reported the following:

- 1) Healthy Strides - The walks will continue at various county parks with different health professional talks and walks on the second and fourth Saturday of each month starting April 11 and concluding October 24th. Good exercise, good information, and good way to see

- the many county parks and the amenities they have to offer. Walks and talks are both done in an hour, 9 a.m. to 10 a.m. Park locations will be on Healthy Medina Website – www.healthymedina.com or Medina County Park website - www.medinacountyparks.com
- 2) Tunnel to Towers Race - Medina is one of 9 cities hosting this race in the nation. Our race was Sunday, September 20, 2015, at 10 a.m., on Public Square.
 - 3) Bicycles - May ride on sidewalk, but become a vehicle unless you walk across crosswalks vs. bike. Also must yield to cars in driveways as cars only need to yield to pedestrians. If pedestrian and bike on same sidewalk, bike is required to yield to pedestrians. If on road, must follow all traffic regulations - stop signs, one way streets, yield signs, etc.
 - 4) Demonstration on Square this evening to “raise awareness” of opiate abuse issues in our community. False statements were made last week that city/county are ignoring the issue and not exercising efforts to address drug abuse. I provided to Council some facts on our efforts both as a city and as a county collaboratively to address these specific concerns. No one is ignoring it. I have worked over three decades in law enforcement in a variety of capacities to address the problems of drug abuse in our community. We will continue to do so.

Keith Dirham, Finance Director, reported that the Mayor referenced the Wings and Wheels show at the publically owned Airport and that if you ever have a chance to make that event they have a lot of vintage aircrafts and cars and many interesting exhibits.

Mr. Dirham stated that he attended a training last week where they went over more of House Bill #5. There is copious information available to get ready for that because we have to pass this ordinance by the end of the year in order to comply with the new income tax rules through the state. Mr. Dirham reported he was sworn in as President of the Ohio Government Finance Officers Association of Ohio by State Auditor Dave Yost. There is a budget hearing tomorrow.

Greg Huber, Law Director, Absent and had no report.

Lt. Birchbickler, Police Dept., had no report.

Chief Painter, Fire Chief, had no report.

Kimberly Marshall, Economic Development Director is asking the public to save November 6th 2015 for our Geared for Success Manufacturing showcase being held at Medina County Fairgrounds from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. There will be over 60 manufacturing exhibits representing Medina County manufacturing companies, 3D printing, demos and a mobile welding lab. The mission of this event is to raise awareness and educate residents, students and businesses as to the economic importance and career opportunities for our manufacturing industry. Key note speaker will be Thomas Frey, a senior futurist at the Da Vinci Institute from Colorado and Google’s top rated futurist speaker. He works closely with a board of visionaries to develop original research studies. We are hoping that more people will come and join us to learn about the future of manufacturing jobs, outlooks, and innovations that can help them translate trends into unique business opportunities. The tickets to see Thomas Frey (\$40) includes registration and breakfast. The exhibits will be open to the public at no cost. This is not a job fair, it’s more about education and awareness. www.madeinmedinacounty.com . The manufacturing showcase opens at 11 a.m., and is free to the public. This is a collaborative event between the cities of Medina, Brunswick and Wadsworth. The next Economic Development Committee meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 1st at 7:45 p.m. in the Multi-Purpose Room at City Hall with a presentation by T & M Associates (handled our Brownfield Grant).

Jonathon Mendel, Planning Community Director, had no report.

Mike Wright, Recreation Center Director, absent.

Jansen Wehrley, Parks and Recreation Director, reported the slashpads were officially closed today. Our Forestry Dept. with fall tree planting will begin the week of October 5th. We will be installing trees on Greenwood Ct., Arbor Ct., Hillview Way, Beechwood Drive, Wildwood Ct. and a variety of other miscellaneous locations.

Dan Gladish, Building Official, had no report.

Patrick Patton, City Engineer, gave an update on the Lake Rd. reconstruction project. The project is completed and the road is open. We have an on-going concrete street repair program entering its fourth week with 3 or 4 more weeks to go moving into the south east and south west portions of town.

Nino Piccoli, Service Director, reported there are some changes to the leaf program. We decided to divide the city in half with south and north and a dividing line at Smith Rd. instead of quadrants. This way we can get one truck in the north and one truck in the south and our third vehicle can be a floater to the heavy areas. We felt the change was needed due to the trucks not making it back to certain quadrants for 3 or 4 weeks sometimes. Our projected start date is the week of October 12th.

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to advertise for competitive bids and to award a contract to the successful bidder for the N. Huntington Street Reconstruction Project. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 117-15, seconded by Mr. Kolesar. Mr. Patton states this is Phase 2 for N. Huntington St. This will reconstruct Huntington between Highland and West Union. Project estimate is over \$1 million dollars. We are getting \$397,000 from OPWC Grant. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 117-15 passed by the yea votes of J. Shields, J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, M. Kolesar, B. Lamb and P. Rose.

Ord. 118-15:

An Ordinance authorizing the purchase of one (1) 2016 Freightliner 108SD Plow Truck from Cleveland Freightliner Inc., dba Valley Freightliner Inc. for the Street Department. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 118-15, seconded by Mr. Kolesar.

Mr. Piccoli stated this request will allow him to replace a 1997 plow truck. Upon approval we plan to have this new truck delivered by midwinter. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 118-15 passed by the yea votes of J. Coyne, B. Hilberg, M. Kolesar, B. Lamb, P. Rose, and J. Shields.

Council Comments:

Mr. Shields announced that Tuesday, October 6th he and Mr. Kolesar will be having their combined Ward 3 & Ward 4 meeting at Ella Canavan Elementary School at 825 Lawrence Street in the gymnasium using the front door on Lawrence St.

Mr. Kolesar spoke of the Wings & Wheels event and all the great things to do while there. He congratulated Mr. Dirham on his accomplishment.

Mr. Rose spoke of the ongoing assembly in the square. We all agree that there is a crisis in this country when it comes to heroin. Mr. Rose feels we need to provide help in getting people treated. He has visited many treatment facilities while employed through LTV Steel working as a labor relations counselor, and none of those facilities, absolutely none of them were ever in a shopping area. They were either tied to a medical facility or out in the country side someplace to be completely away from the environment the addicts lived in to help reduce the temptation that could be present with their current environment. We are just trying to preserve what we have in the shopping district and get treatment to those who need it.

Mr. Coyne stated there is a General Fund budget meeting tomorrow to discuss the departments that are funded through the general fund. Mr. Coyne welcomed the Mayor back from vacation stating it was very exciting being the "Acting" Mayor for the short period of time.

The following 123-15 enacted by the City of Medina of Medina County, Ohio,
(Ordinance/Resolution)
hereinafter referred to as the City, in the matter of the stated described project.

SECTION I - Project Description

WHEREAS, the State has identified the need for the described project:

This project consists of widening and safety improvements for approximately 1.44 miles of US 42 from South of Harding Street to 950 ft south of Fenn Road and tie into associated local cross streets. The construction includes pavement widening, sidewalks, multi-use path, raised median, traffic control, traffic signals, lighting, water line replacement and drainage improvements.

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in calendar year 2016 and be completed in 2017.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City of Medina of Medina County, Ohio.

SECTION II - Consent Statement

Being in the public interest, the City gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the above described project.

SECTION III - Cooperation Statement

The City shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation, for the portion of this project within the Medina Corporation limit, as follows:

- 1) *The city agrees to assume and bear a fixed cost of \$1,100,000 for the Construction costs, which include Construction and Construction Engineering.*
- 2) *The city agrees to assume and bear the waterline costs, which include Construction and Construction Engineering and is estimated to be approximately \$950,300.*
- 3) *ODOT agrees to assume and bear the waterline costs on both West and East Reagan Parkway at conflict points. The city made a decision not to have a full replacement of the waterline on West and East Reagan Parkway.*
- 4) *Due to the re-design of the construction plans to remove the waterline from both West and East Reagan Parkway, the city agrees to assume and bear the re-design*

costs of approximately \$5,000.

- 5) *The city agrees to assume and bear the additional Construction costs associated with the alternate bid items, if chosen by the city, for the decorative luminaire heads. The decorative luminaire heads additional cost is estimated at approximately \$62,000.*
- 6) *The city's intent is to NOT have decorative light poles or decorative bracket arms for the lights. There has been alternate bid items setup in the plan in case the city decides to pay the additional costs for decorative light poles and decorative bracket arms. The decorative light poles approximate additional cost is \$98,000 and the decorative bracket arms approximate additional cost is \$80,000.*
- 7) *The city agrees to assume and bear the additional Construction costs associated with the alternate bid items, if chosen by the city, for the decorative traffic signal poles and the decorative traffic signal mast arms. The decorative traffic signal poles and decorative traffic signal mast arms additional cost is estimated at approximately \$410,000.*

SECTION IV - Maintenance

Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the City shall:

- 1) Provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal law;
- 2) Provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the described project;
- 3) Maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION V - Utilities and Right-of-Way Statement

The City agrees to be responsible for all utility accommodation, relocation, and reimbursement, as described above, and agrees that all such accommodations, relocations, and reimbursements shall comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual
