Now that Cuyahoga, Lorain and Summit Counties are among the twelve Ohio counties to be designated Level 3 Red Alert Public Emergency areas because of the rapidly rising number of Coronavirus cases, it is critical that visitors and residents of Medina County do everything possible to keep Medina County from going "Red".

Over 40% of Medina County residents go to work in these three counties. In addition, 68% of the workers coming to work in Medina County from another Ohio county are coming from Cuyahoga, Lorain and Summit counties, as well as the numbers who come to shop or visit from these counties on a daily basis.

While masks wearing is mandated in the Red counties, Medina County residents and workers must be on high alert.
